



## LTC Associate Degree Nursing Program Outcomes (POs) and Success Measures

6.1 Students will demonstrate achievement of each End of Program Student Learning Outcome (EOPSLO) at 80% or higher each semester. The Systematic Evaluation Plan changed and is based on ACEN 2017 standards. Therefore, only data from spring 2018 is currently available under the new standards.
