			<b>Other Program Expectations</b>
			You will need to:
			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Complete a Health/TB/Tetanus Form prior to required clinical experience.</li> <li>• Walk.</li> <li>• Climb.</li> <li>• Possess upper/lower body strength. Able to lift 125 pounds.</li> </ul>
			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Speak.</li> <li>• Listen.</li> </ul>
			<b>In addition to the four hours per week of scheduled class time, students will be expected to spend four hours per week in the EMS Lab.</b>
			<b>Approximate Costs</b>
			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• \$132 per credit (resident)</li> <li>• \$198 per credit (out-of-state resident)</li> <li>• Other fees vary by program (books, supplies, materials, tools, uniforms, health-related exams, etc.)</li> </ul>
			<b>Special Note</b>
			Students must be at least 18 years of age to sit for the National Registry Exam, but students who are 17 may take the class.
