

CPR REQUIREMENTS

The required CPR components include 1-person, 2-person, infant, child, adult, and AED (Automatic External Defibrillator) training. There are a few ways you can obtain CPR certification.

- Through your Wisconsin Technical College BLS Healthcare Provider is the CPR class offered by Lakeshore Technical College and the Wisconsin Technical College system. These classes are usually four hours long. To register, contact the Registration Desk at the closest technical college to you. For LTC, please call 920.693.1366.
- Through American Red Cross CPR for the Professional Rescuer is the class offered by your local chapter of the American Red Cross that meets LTC program requirements. These classes usually run on a monthly basis and have limited availability. Please note that you will need to ask them to add the AED class for an additional small fee.
- Through Other Organizations Several organizations offer CPR classes. It
 is your responsibility to make sure they meet the requirements of the program
 you are entering. Again, your class needs to consist of the following: 1person, 2-person, infant, child, adult, and AED (Automatic External
 Defibrillator) training.

For Early Childhood Education and Child Care Services programs ONLY: Your programs require proof of an Infant/Child course with AED (Automatic External Difribrillator) training. You can take any of the above courses to satisfy this requirement or you could look into the Heartsaver Child/Infant CPR courses that are offered through LTC.
