

## IN-TEXT CITATIONS

Always include an in-text citation after the quoted material, so your Instructor knows which source belongs with a quote.

**Format:** "Last name, year published, page\*".

\* If there are no page numbers use paragraph numbers if applicable. Example: (Jones, 2012, para. 4)

### AUTHOR NAMED IN PARENTHESES

She stated, "Students often had difficulty using APA style" (Jones, 2012, p. 6), but she did not offer an explanation as to why.

### AUTHOR NAMED IN A SIGNAL PHRASE

Jones (2012) stated, "Students often had difficulty using APA style" (p. 6).

### AUTHOR UNKNOWN

Mention the work's title or give the first word or two of the title in the parenthetical citation. ("Television," 2002).

### ORGANIZATION AS AUTHOR

Name the organization in the signal phrase or in the parenthetical citation the first time you cite the source. (Henry J. Kaiser Family Foundation, 2004, p. 1).

### LONG QUOTES


Quotations longer than 40 words need to be set apart from the rest of the text and do not get quotation marks. The quote should be in a new paragraph and indented. (Hit the "Tab" once). Double spacing still applies. When the quote is complete, put the in-text citation after the long quote as you would any other quote. If you start a new paragraph, use regular margins.

## PAPER FORMAT

Unless your instructor gives you other instructions, set up your paper with the following guidelines:

- Double-spaced on standard paper. Under the paragraph section in the Home tab in Word.



Click on  Select 2.0.

- 1 inch margins on all sides
- 12pt. Font
- APA style requires past tense or present perfect tense when using signal phrases to describe earlier research, for example, Jones (2012) **found...** or Jones (2012) **has found...**

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## REFERENCE PAGE

This is a separate page at the end of your paper.

- Each citation in the paper must be listed on the Reference page and likewise, each listing on this page must be quoted or paraphrased in the paper.
- Alphabetize the list by last name(s) of the author (or editor); if a work has no author or editor, alphabetize by the first word of the title other than *A*, *An*, or *The*.
- Title of this page should be centered and labeled References without bolding or underlining.
- All text is double-spaced, just like the rest of the paper.
- Each separate citation should be hanging. To do so, highlight the entire citation, right-click on the highlighted text, click paragraph, under *special*, choose *hanging*.

## CITING A BOOK

### Basic format:

Author, A. A. (Year of publication). Title of work with first letter only capitalized: Subtitle with only first letter capitalized. Location: Publisher.

### Example:

Houghton, P. M. & Houghton, T. J. (2015). APA: The easy way. Flint, Mich.: Baker College.

## CITING A MAGAZINE / JOURNAL

### Basic Format:

Author, A. A., Author, B. B., & Author, C. C. (Year). Title of article. *Title of periodical*, volume#(issue#), pages.

### Example:

Eksi, G. (2012). Peer review versus teacher feedback in process writing: How effective?. *International Journal of Applied Educational Studies*, 13(1), 33-48.



## CITING A WEBSITE

### Basic Format:

Author, A. A., & Author B. B. (Date of publication). Title of document or page. Retrieved from <http://web.address>

### Example:

Angeli, E.A., Wagner, J., Lawrick, E., Moore, K., Anderson, M., Soderlund, L., & Brizee, A.I. (2016). Retrieved from <http://someaddress.com/full/url>

## CITING A WEBSITE WITH NO AUTHOR

### Basic Format:

Title of webpage page. (Date). Retrieved from <http://web.address>

### Example:

What causes Alzheimer's disease? (2014). Retrieved from <http://memorystudy.org/alzheimers.causes.htm>

## CITING A WEBSITE WITH NO DATE

### Basic Format:

Author, A. (n.d). Title of webpage page. Retrieved from <http://web.address>

### Example:

Archer, D. (n.d.). Exploring nonverbal communication Retrieved from <http://nonverbal.ucsc.edu>

## CITING AN INTERVIEW OR E-MAIL

APA does not require you cite personal communications (interviews you've conducted, e-mail messages, etc.) in your reference list. Instead, give an in-text citation only.

### Basic Format of In-Text Citation:

(B.Grossman, personal communication, June 15, 2017).

### Another example of In-Text Citation:

B. Grossman also claimed that many of his students had difficulties with APA style (personal communication, June 15, 2017).



## CITING A SOURCE WITHIN A SOURCE

**Scenario:** You read a 2013 article by Linhares and Brum that cites an earlier article, by Frederick. You want to cite part of Frederick's article, but you haven't read Frederick's article itself.

### Example Reference entry:

Linhares, A., & Brum, P. (2013). Understanding our understanding of strategic scenarios: What role do chunks play? *Cognitive Science*, 31(6), 989-1007. <http://dx.doi.org/doi:10.1080/03640210701703725>

Your Reference list will contain the article you read, by Linhares and Brum. Your Reference list will NOT contain a citation for Frederick's article.

### In-Text Citation:

Frederick's study (as cited in Linhares & Brum, 2013) found that...

Your in-text citation gives credit to Frederick and shows the source in which you found Frederick's ideas.

## CITING A MOTION PICTURE

### Basic Format:

Producer, P. P. (Producer), & Director, D. D. (Director). (Date of publication). Title of motion picture [Motion picture]. Country of origin: Studio or distributor.

### Example:

Smith, J. D. (Producer), & Smithee, A. F. (Director). (2001). *Really big disaster movie* [Motion picture]. United States: Paramount Pictures.
